

"... Here, at this juncture, as the plaintiffs plead, they have been deprived of a Federal Constitutional
- sovereign immunity. ... "For the reasons stated, plaintiffs' motion for leave to file an amended complaint, in so far as the plaintiffs only seek declaratory and injunctive relief, is allowed."
